What is Bite Sized Learning?

Bite Sized Learning is a new suite of online learning content specifically for graduate members of Engineers Australia. Bite Sized Learning sits within the existing MyCPD platform.

Why was Bite Sized Learning created?

Bite Sized Learning has been created in order to fill a gap in our current product offering for graduate members and has been designed to provide them with additional learning opportunities aimed at keeping them a step ahead as they start to build their career.

Who can access Bite Sized Learning?

Bite Sized Learning is specifically for graduate members of Engineers Australia only!

I am currently a participant of Engineers Australia's Graduate Program that is run by Engineering Education Australia. Will I be able to access Bite Sized Learning as well? How does Mentor Match work?

Yes, you will. As a participant of Engineers Australia's Graduate Program, you will be provided with access to the suite of Bite Sized Learning modules for the duration of the program.

Where can I find the Bite Sized Learning platform?

Bite Sized Learning sits within the existing MyCPD platform, but only graduate members will be able to access it.

Navigate to the MyCPD platform - www.mycpd.engineersaustralia.org.au - register and create a profile, including your EA member ID and you're in.

If you already have a MyCPD account you are one step closer—simply log in, edit your account details to include your EA Member ID and you are ready to start learning.

To ensure exclusivity, a valid EA member ID must be recorded as part of your MyCPD account. If you are not an active graduate member of EA, you won't be able to access.

The platform has been designed to be mobile friendly, allowing access to learning opportunities at anytime, anywhere by using desktop, laptop, tablet or mobile devices.

Who is developing the content on Bite Sized Learning?

The content for Bite Sized Learning is developed by Engineering Education Australia, in collaboration with Engineers Australia. As Engineers Australia's training and development arm, Engineering Education Australia are well attuned to the needs of today's graduate engineers.

What kind of short courses will be available on Bite Sized Learning?

Bite Sized Learning modules combine video, informative case studies, and interactive engaging activities to provide short and sharp targeted learning moments which can be accessed at home, work, or on the move.

Content is largely targeted towards supporting the underpinning skills that contribute towards developing attainment of Engineers Australia's Stage 2 chartered competencies. Although some general knowledge and broad skills-based modules will also be developed.

What is the difference between the courses already available on My CPD and the courses that will be available on Bite Sized Learning?

Unlike the rest of MyCPD's extensive library of professional development modules, Bite Sized Learning has been specifically designed with graduate engineers in mind.

Bite Sized Learning modules have also been optimised to work on mobile and desktop devices and are kept short and sharp to fit effortlessly into a graduate's busy lifestyle.

Can I earn CPD points by completing modules in Bite Sized Learning?

Yes, you can. Generally, 0.5 CPD points will be assigned to each Bite Sized Learning module. This reflects the level of learning able to be incorporated into each module, as well as acknowledging learners who 'take it to the next level' and invest time shaping their answers and responses.

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What if I am not a graduate member of Engineers Australia and want to access Bite Sized Learning?

Unfortunately, you won't be able to. Bite Sized Learning is exclusively available to EA graduate members only.

Who manages the Bite Sized Learning suite of content?

The Bite Sized Learning suite of content is jointly managed by Engineers Australia and Engineering Education Australia (EEA).
